Legacy of Dorothy Shawhan lives on at University Press of Mississippi

JACKSON, Miss -- The University Press of Mississippi announces a generous contribution from the DSU Foundation, the Delta State University Division of Languages & Literature, and friends and family of Professor Dorothy Shawhan to the UPM First Author's Fund. The combined gift of over \$2500 in honor of the late Professor Shawhan is in conjunction with the placement and dedication of a Mississippi Writer's Trail marker honoring Shawhan, to be placed on the campus of Delta State University, Friday, July 23, 2021, at 2:00 p.m.

A prolific author and scholar, Shawhan published numerous books and articles including two with UPM:

Fannye Cook: Mississippi's Pioneering Conservationist
Spirit of the Delta: The Art of Carolyn Norris

The UPM First Author's Fund, established through generous gifts from Press authors, supports the publication of books by emerging scholars, nontraditional authors, and authors from a wide variety of backgrounds. The Fund supports the work of these authors so they can achieve success regardless of their academic status or access to resources. Funds may be used to offset a variety of expenses, including printing, permissions, editing, or other costs.
